

Retrieving Your Results:

Now that you've learned a little bit about searching within the database *Academic OneFile*, let's look at some results.

Your search for OBAMA AND ELECTION will obtain a list of results. Some databases, such as *Academic OneFile*, contain some full-text articles. Others only provide citations (which are information about the article) or citations including abstracts (which summarize the article's content). Many of the Library's databases offer **Get It!**, a system which will look in all of the Library's print and electronic journal records to locate a copy of the article for you.

Click on **Get It!**

When you see a green check mark beside the first option "Link to This Article", the link will take you directly to the article you need.

A green check mark beside "Link to This Journal" means the link will take you to the publisher's website for this electronic journal. You will be able to find the article you need by searching for the article title or selecting the specific volume, issue, and year in which the article was published. This information is given in the citation at the top of the **Get It!** page.

When you see a check mark beside DELCAT, the link takes you to the DELCAT record for the journal. Since you are looking for an article published in one specific issue of this journal, click on "Holdings" to see whether the Library has the issue that you need. You will be able to find the journal at the location and call number indicated.

If you do not see a checkmark next to any of the first three options, this means that the University of Delaware Library does not have access to a print or online copy of the article. However, you can request that the Library's Interlibrary Loan office obtain the article for you from another library free of charge by clicking on the "Obtain a copy of this item" link under last option: Interlibrary Loan. The next section of the tutorial will explain Interlibrary Loan services in more detail.
