

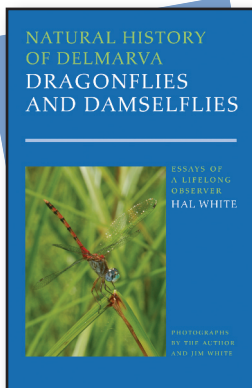

Hal White received a B.S. in Biochemistry from Penn State University and a Ph.D. in Biochemistry from Brandeis University. His research interests include the structure, function and evolution of vitamin-binding proteins, intermediary metabolism and biochemical evolution.

Professor White is also widely known throughout Delaware and the Mid-Atlantic Region as an expert on the dragonflies of the northeastern United States. He will speak about his book *Natural History of Delmarva Dragonflies and Damselflies: Essays of a Lifelong Observer* which was published in 2011 by the University of Delaware Press. The book provides the first comprehensive coverage of the dragonflies and damselflies of the Delmarva Peninsula and includes colored photographs of all 129 species known to occur in the region.

Unlike field guides, *Natural History of Delmarva Dragonflies and Damselflies* can be read for pleasure and enjoyment from beginning to end. That was the author's intent because the study of these large and beautiful insects has provided pleasure and enjoyment to him as a hobby for more than fifty years. Each species in his book provides a prompt for a story, brief essay or reflection. He will share some of these vignettes in his illustrated talk.
