- Over 2.8 million books and bound periodicals
- Over 3.4 million microforms including U.S. patents
- Over 30,000 electronic and print journals including newspapers to which the Library provides access
- Over 5,300 linear feet of manuscripts and archives
- Seating for over 3,000 persons in the Morris Library.

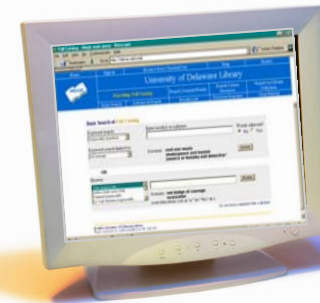

The Morris Library is centrally located on the University of Delaware campus in Newark, Delaware.

Five Libraries

The University of Delaware Library is comprised of the Morris Library where the main collection is housed, three branch libraries located in Newark, Delaware, and a fourth branch library located in Lewes, Delaware.

Morris Library, the main library, is centrally located on the South Green of the University of Delaware campus at 181 South College Avenue in Newark, Delaware.

Agriculture Library is in Room 025 of Townsend Hall on the Southern Campus of the University of Delaware in Newark, Delaware.

Chemistry Library is in Room 202 of the Brown Laboratory on the Central Campus of the University of Delaware in Newark, Delaware.

Physics Library is in Room 221 of Sharp Laboratory on the Central Campus of the University of Delaware in Newark, Delaware.

Marine Studies Library is in Cannon Laboratory in Lewes, Delaware, approximately 90 miles south of the Newark campus.

Borrowing from the Circulating Collection

Students, faculty, and staff from Delaware Technical and Community College and Delaware State University may obtain a University of Delaware Library borrower card at no charge by presenting a valid institution identification card. The University of Delaware Library borrower card and the institution identification card must be presented each time materials are borrowed. **Books need to be returned to the library from which they are borrowed.** The loan period for most items is 30 days. Overdue fines are charged if materials are returned late.



Computer Access

The Library has more than 200 public workstations with access to the Internet, library databases and electronic journals. All Library public computers within the Morris Library are accessible to Delaware State University and Delaware Technical and Community College users. There is a fee per page for printing from Library workstations.

Instructional Media Collection

The Instructional Media Collection includes more than 20,000 videos and films which may be viewed within the Morris Library on carrels in the Instructional Media Collection Department on the lower level of the Morris Library. Only in-library use of media is available to Delaware State University and Delaware Technical & Community College users with their college/university identification card and a University of Delaware Library borrower card.

Reference Services

Students, faculty, and staff from Delaware State University and Delaware Technical & Community College may come to the Reference Desk in the Morris Library or call for assistance at 302-831-2965.

Renewing Books

Books should be returned or renewed by the due date. Books may be returned to the book drops at the front entrance of the Morris Library when the library is closed. To arrange to have books renewed by Library staff, call the Morris Library Circulation Desk at 302-831-2455 when the library is open. The Student Multimedia Design Center is located on the lower level of the Morris Library with more than 80 workstations that have multimedia and general application software. Current Delaware State University and Delaware Technical & Community College students, faculty and staff with ID cards should check at the Student Multimedia Design Center service desk for assistance in logging on to multimedia workstations.
